All scholarships are based on merit and carry a fixed monetary value:

Academic scholarships	£500

Academic Scholarship Examination Morning: Saturday, 1 December.

Art, Performing Arts (Dance, Drama & Music) and Sports Scholarships will take place at the start of the Spring Term (date to be confirmed).

Sixth Form scholarships are awarded and maintained on the understanding that the scholar will remain enthusiastic and committed to their recognised field and will maintain the standards of excellence against which the award is offered.



Academic Scholarships

What do we offer Academic Scholars at St Gabriel's?

- All Academic Scholars will take part in the Scholarship Mentoring Programme;
- A fixed financial award of £500 is available for all Sixth Form Academic Scholars.

What do we look for in a potential Academic Scholar?

- A spirit of intellectual curiosity that goes beyond the work set in the classroom;
- A sense of independence in her learning and a curiosity to extend her own knowledge;
- Ability to articulate and demonstrate her thinking skills clearly.

What are our expectations of an Academic Scholar?

- High level of attainment in examinations;
- High levels of attainment and engagement;
- Involvement in enriching activities both within and outside school, for example clubs and societies, competitions, summer schools and lectures.

What is the assessment process for Sixth Form Academic Scholarships?

- Candidates should apply for Academic Scholarships by Friday, 23 November;
- Candidates will sit scholarship papers on the morning of Saturday, 1 December;
- The scholarship papers will involve tasks designed to assess thinking skills and intellectual curiosity;
- Candidates will have an interview with the Principal and the Head of Sixth Form.



Art Scholarships

What do we offer Art Scholars at St Gabriel's?

- All Art Scholars will take part in the Scholarship Mentoring Programme, which will form the basis of an annual review meeting with the Head of Art and senior staff;
- Scholars will display their work at the Art Department's end of year exhibition;
- Scholars are offered opportunities to take part in after-school studio work and will receive additional art mentoring;
- Scholars are invited to art master classes, for example life drawing;
- They will be invited to attend a termly Scholars' Breakfast with the Principal;
- A fixed financial award of £200 is available for all Sixth Form Art Scholars.

What do we look for in a potential Art Scholar?

- Art Scholars must have good drawing skills and a willingness to practise and develop these skills;
- They should have an ability to experiment with different media and a wide colour palette;
- An Art Scholar should be capable of demonstrating independence and imagination in their work.

What are our expectations of an Art Scholar?

- Art Scholars should regularly run one of the art clubs at lunchtime or after school;
- They should enter art competitions promoted by the Art Department and seek to promote their work through exhibitions and display;
- Art Scholars are always expected to produce high quality work, both in lessons and as homework;
- They should be available to assist the Art Department on Open Mornings and at community events.

What is the assessment process for Art Scholarships?

- Candidates are asked to present a portfolio;
- All candidates will undertake a short interview with the Principal and Head of Art and should expect to discuss the content of their portfolio.

Dance Scholarships

What do we offer Dance Scholars at St Gabriel's?

- All Dance Scholars will build an electronic record of achievement and development, which will form the basis of an annual review meeting with the Head of Dance and senior staff;
- Once a term, Dance Scholars will be invited to take part in a Scholars' Master Class designed to help develop their technical ability;
- Dance Scholars will be invited to attend a termly Scholars' Breakfast with the Principal;
- A fixed financial award of £200 is available for all Sixth Form Dance Scholars.

What do we look for in a potential Dance Scholar?

- Dance Scholars need to show technical ability and aptitude in the following three areas: choreography, performance and appreciation. This can be in one or a variety of different dance genres/styles but successful candidates should also be adaptable and creative, as well as able to demonstrate a drive and passion for dance;
- A Dance Scholar should be an outstanding role model to their dance peers as well as taking on a lead supporting role within the Dance Department.

What are our expectations of a Dance Scholar?

- Dance Scholars are expected to feature in major school productions and should be prepared to take on a range of challenging roles;
- Scholars are expected to demonstrate a passion for dance by attending live performances and taking part in a range of extra-curricular dance classes;
- All Scholars are expected to support the work of the Dance Department and to demonstrate an ability to work as part of a team;
- They should be available to assist the Dance Department on Open Mornings and at community events.

What is the assessment process for Dance Scholarships?

- The Head of Dance will invite applicants of an eligible standard to attend a practical assessment and interview;
- We will be looking for evidence of considerable technical ability in at least one dance style (performance), a demonstration of aptitude and the ability to learn set technical phrases in other genres, as well as responding to a stimulus (choreography & appreciation).
- Candidates will be asked to bring evidence of recent successes and achievements to support their applications.



Drama Scholarships

What do we offer Drama Scholars at St Gabriel's?

- All Drama Scholars will take part in the Scholarship Mentoring Programme and will build a record of achievement and development, which will form the basis of an annual review meeting with the Head of Drama and senior staff;
- Once a term Drama Scholars will be invited to take part in a scholars' workshop designed to help develop stage skills;
- Drama Scholars will be invited to attend an annual scholars' theatre trip;
- Drama Scholars will be invited to attend a termly Scholars' Breakfast with the Principal;
- A fixed financial award of £200 is available for all Sixth Form Drama Scholars.

What do we look for in a potential Drama Scholar?

- Drama Scholars are students who demonstrate strong performance skills, creativity in shaping drama and the ability to be a highly effective member of a theatre company;
- They need to have an impressive performance record, although this can all be based on school productions;
- Ideally, they should have wide experience of live theatre and they need to demonstrate they can analyse the theatrical choices and skills required to create successful performance.

What are our expectations of a Drama Scholar?

- Drama Scholars are expected to feature in major school productions and should be prepared to take on a range of challenging roles;
- Scholars are expected to demonstrate a passion for the theatre by attending live performances and reading plays and reviews;
- All scholars are expected to support the work of the Drama Department, be an ambassador for Drama at St Gabriel's, demonstrate an ability to work as part of a team and run Drama Clubs for younger pupils;
- They should be available to assist the Drama Department on Open Mornings and at community events.

What is the assessment process for Drama Scholarships?

- Students are invited to attend an audition, where they will take part in an improvisation workshop, perform a prepared monologue (unless taking GCSE Drama) and be interviewed by the Principal and Head of Drama.



Music Scholarships

What do we offer Music Scholars at St Gabriel's?

- All Music Scholars will take part in the individualised Scholarship Mentoring Programme with the Director of Music and will build a record of achievement and development, which will form the basis of an annual review meeting with the Director of Music and senior staff;
- They will take part in an annual Music Scholars' Concert;
- Special scholars-only events are put on, including talks from musicians and industry professionals, and trips to hear music-making by professionals;
- They will be invited to attend a termly Scholars' Breakfast with the Principal;
- A fixed financial award of £200 is available for all Sixth Form Music Scholars.

What do we look for in a potential Music Scholar?

- Enthusiasm, skill, a willingness to engage in the ensembles and music making of the school, and a passion for their subject as well as a desire to improve their skills.
- Music Scholars lead music in the school and as role models encourage and inspire other musicians.

What are our expectations of a Music Scholar?

- Music Scholars are expected to participate in a range of appropriate orchestras and choirs, and to take a lead role in musical performances throughout the school year;
- Scholars are expected to practise consistently and to aim for continuous improvement in their technical ability;
- Music Scholars are expected to maintain high academic standards at all times, and to demonstrate an ability to balance the demands of their academic studies against their involvement in music;
- All Scholars are expected to support the work of the Music Department, and to demonstrate an ability to work as part of a team;
- They should be available to assist the Music Department on Open Mornings and at concerts and community events.

What is the assessment process for Music Scholarships?

- The Director of Music will invite applicants of an eligible standard to attend a practical assessment and interview. Candidates are asked to prepare performances on their first instrument and one piece on their second. All candidates will undertake a short interview with the Principal and the Director of Music.



Sports Scholarships

What do we offer Sports Scholars at St Gabriel's?

- All Sports Scholars will take part in the individualised Scholarship Mentoring Programme and will build a record of achievement and development, which will form the basis of an annual review meeting with the Director of Sport and senior staff;
- Sports Scholars will meet regularly with specialist sports staff to assist in the development of a personalised training and nutrition plan;
- Scholars will receive specialist coaching in our seasonal and participation sports;
- Sports Scholars will be invited to attend an annual Scholars' sports trip;
- Sports Scholars will be invited to attend a termly Scholars' Breakfast with the Principal;
- A fixed financial award of £200 is available for all Sixth Form Sports Scholars.

What do we look for in a potential Sports Scholar?

- A Sports Scholar will excel at county, national or international level in one or more sports;
- Successful applicants will be expected to be fully involved in school sport and to represent the school in fixtures or in equestrian events;
- They will be a role model for other pupils in training, fixtures and as a scholar athlete.

What are our expectations of a Sports Scholar?

- Sports Scholars are expected to compete for the school in all the sports for which they are selected;
- Sports Scholars should attend all Sports Scholars' Briefings. These typically cover heart rate training, nutrition, supplementary sports exercises, strength and conditioning workshops etc;
- Sports Scholars need to maintain the academic standards and ethos of the school and be role models both on and off the sports pitch;
- All Scholars are expected to support the work of the Sports Department, be an ambassador for sport at St Gabriel's and demonstrate an ability to work as part of a team;
- They should be available to assist the Sports Department on Open Mornings and at community events.

What is the assessment process for Sports Scholarships?

- Candidates will be invited to take part in a range of assessment activities including an interview with the Director of Sport and the Principal;
- They must be performing or representing to at least regional level.

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
