Staff signature: To show you have completed a task (and in the end, a full Challenge) you need to have your portfolio checked and your challenge signed off by a member of the Junior School. To gain that signature, you must ensure: (1) Your entry is in your own words, not copied from a guide book etc. (2) You can talk about what you have seen, read or heard with interest and enthusiasm. (3) You have challenged yourself to do the task – it should have been enjoyable but difficult to complete.
