


A list of recommended reading books, covering a diverse range of subjects, are suggested below, with an extensive range of further options available from the school library.

At first the unpleasantness and petty meanness appears simply spiteful. But when spoilt Leonora is not given the birthday present of a specific doll that she wants, affairs take a much darker turn with terrifying consequences.




